Devon Over 50s IIs Season 2019

Our season was a long one with 14 games - starting on April 19th with a win over Devon Ladies, and finishing with a somewhat anti-climatic Plate Final on September 5th against a strong Middlesex side.

Reaching the Plate Final at all was of course some achievement for us. Having won four out of ten League matches (which is about par for the course for us over the years) we had Hertfordshire at home in the ¼ final – a thrilling game which was finished in almost pitchblack Monsoon-like conditions as Marty Causey and Nick Rogers saw us home as the heavens opened, with barely a ball to spare. Earlier Neal Peach had taken 2 for 14 off nine overs to restrict Herts to 155. Neal was almost unplayable.

Our home Semi-Final against Surrey did not get off to the best of starts – the Surrey team arrived at Bradninch at 10am thinking it was a 12 o'clock start. Most of the Devon team, thinking it was a 1pm start, got lost in the village and arrived late anyway, with only four players at the ground by the time we tossed up, and only six were there by 1pm. Luckily we won the toss, and batted first, eventually winning by 81 runs.

Our League programme was, as it is most years, a bit hit and miss. Two excellent wins over Hampshire, and two nail-biting matches against Wiltshire were the highlights. At home Wilts scored 309 off their 45 overs, and we were up with the run rate from the go, falling just short at 303 for 8. The return fixture was just as tense - Wilts making 246 for 7, and Devon just getting over the line thanks to a maiden Seniors hundred from Nick Rogers. Seriously Nick – it's about time – how many games have you played already?!?

There were quite a few notable individual performances this year – three centurions – the afore mentioned Nick Rogers' 101* against Wilts, James Ford also scored his maiden ton for us, against Somerset on his home ground, and Ian Hayter hit 105 against Surrey.

Ian also hit three half centuries , as did Jeff Heath, and Nick Rogers, Mark Andrews and Adrian Pullin all hit two.

Of the bowlers, Tim Cooke was once again the leading wicket-taker with 14 at 23 apiece. But Keith Wakeham took his 11 wickets at just 9.91, and was the only bowler to get a 5-fer with a best of 5-21 against Surrey. Keith took a wicket every 19 balls. Both Joel Murphy and James Ford took 4 wickets in an innings, and Neal Peach was the only bowler to concede less than 3 runs per over.

In total we used 35 different players from 21 clubs from all over the county, and ten new players made their debut.

In spite of this large player base, at times we relied heavily on the Over 60s to help us get out a team. Nick Rogers in particular enjoyed himself playing with us youngsters, scoring 266 runs at 88.

There were many champagne moments this year, too many to mention them all here... Johnny Wells-West racing round the boundary as if his life depended on it; Nick Rogers hitting a 6 to win the match against Wilts and to bring up his century; comprehensively beating Surrey when most of our team turned up late; the Mitchell brothers putting on a hundred against Hampshire; trying to find the umpire at lvybridge when he was in the changing room all the time ...it was in many ways a memorable season. My thanks to all the players who played for us; to the scorers Jolyon Huxtable and John Weeks, to the umpires – particularly Roger Tolchard - and Tim Chapman, who did most of our games.

The award for Number One Fan is shared between Tom Cooper's dad – and Rob Lambert's dog Jasper. Your support was much appreciated!

The five clubs that hosted us this year – Bradninch, Bideford, Kilmington, Ivybridge and Whimple – all looked after us really well – we really appreciate all the work they do for us.

My thanks also to the Committee and particularly to Dave our Chair whose tireless work on our behalf will be sorely missed.
