The innings were separated by a fine tea as sunshine and a breeze was steadily drying out the ground.

The Berkshire innings proceeded at a steady pace and despite miserly bowling by Botton – 16 runs from 9 overs – and a couple of neat stumpings off the bowling of Berman, they proceeded to knock off the required runs in 25 overs.
