With these attributes & a big squad of players Devon won 7 games out of 7 to reach the final & everyone contributed in some way .Alsop ,Coe ,Cavendish, Barter, Canning, Adams & Gambie were all outstanding cricketers in their own right but couldn't gain a regular place

On the evening Stuart Lott told the story of the final where Lancashire full of ex pros were blown away with Devon scoring 255 for 3 with Macey again scoring 103 & Whitby 73. Theedom & Howard adding 50 runs in the last 5 overs .In reply Lancashire were soon in trouble with Rose 2 for 14 & Lott 1 for 16 of 9 overs being eventually restricted to 174 for 7. This was only the second time in our history that Devon have won the Over 50s National championship

Chris Theedom thanked everyone for attending the 15th anniversary dinner but special mention was made of our scorer's contribution Chris Dove who still scores for the Over 50s now

At the dinner memories were given by Bob Eames on the sea ferry crossing to Jersey ,Pete Rose & finally Brent Howard on what he can remember about the after match evening at the Cavern Club, Liverpool

Finally a toast was made to all our wonderful wives who backed & followed us throughout
